# **Airline Chatter**

Delta Airlines ordered 100 Boeing 737-900-ERs for \$8.5 Billion. They are to be delivered from 2013 through 2018. They will replace all Douglas DC-9s, all Boeing 757s and some early Airbus A-320s. Delta Airlines will be ordering more aircraft in a few more years. For now, this is it. With a range of 3,200 miles, the 737-900ER can operate on any domestic route offered by Delta Airlines. Delivery rates are 12 in 2013, 19 per year in 2014 through 2017, and 12 in 2018. They hold up to 180 passengers in a typical two class layout.

Russia's President Dimitry Medvedved said after the crash of the Yak-43 that killed the Russian hockey players, that there are too many domestic airliners in Russia, so he is going to try and eliminate most of them.

Federal Express is considering ordering wide-bodied freighters from Boeing and Airbus as they update their fleet of cargo aircraft. Most of the major passenger airlines already have ordered airliners to update their fleets. Fed Ex is looking at the Boeing 767 and the Airbus A-330 for that requirement.

Delta Airlines is laving off 200 administrative employees. This is due to high fuel prices, parking a few airliners, and a drop in demand for seats.

Southwest Airlines has 25 Boeing737-800s due to be delivered next year. Southwest Airlines has about 100 on order.

Boeing's research department says that China will need 5,000 airliners in the next 20 years. Boeing's twin-aisle 787 Dreamliner will account for over 1,000 of the 5.000 and 3.500 will be single-aisle airliners, like the 737. The remainder will be larger, long-haul aircraft like the 747 or the 777.

Boeing research department savs the world-wide demand for more airliners will be 33,500 in the next 20 years. That comes out of about to about \$4 Trillion.

Delta Airlines says that they will reduce its 2012 capacity by 3%. This year in November and December, Delta Airlines will cut 4% to 5% of the capacity. Delta will also reduce flying to Europe by 12%.

2013.

United Airlines/Continental Airlines w ill not decrease its capacity in 2012.

Air France/KLM splat a \$12 Billion order for long-range airliners following a year long negotiation, announcing plans to purchase 25 Boeing 787 Dreamliners, and 25 Airbus A-350s

United Airlines/Continental Airlines is planning to place a large order f or airliners by the end of the year.

Delta Airlines will be making charter flights to Cuba starting December 7 from Atlanta, Also planned are charters from JFK to Cuba starting November 6, and Miami to Cuba charters. Charters from Miami to Cuba began on October 1.

Delta Airlines' large order for 100 Boeing 737-900ERs is the second largest order for the 737 - first is Lion Air of Indonesia. For Delta Airlines, the 737 will replace 115 older 757-200s, 16 767s, and 69 Airbus A-

Southwest Airlines will not decrease its capacity in 2012 or 320s in the domestic fleet. Delta Airlines has yet to decide on a replacement for t he 31 Douglas DC-9s. and 117 MD-80s.

Delta Airlines hauled in \$3.6 Billion in excess baggage fees last year.

Boeing delivered its first 787 Dreamliner to All Nippon Airways on September 23. It was about 3 years late. More than 800 are on order.

Frontier Airlines will lay off more than 200 employees in November as the carrier reduces service to Milwaukee.

Boeing announced that UT Air of Russia ordered 7 Boeing 737-900ERs and 33 Boeing 737-800s. The value if \$3.8 Billion.

Avianca, the airline of Columbia, has ordered 4 more Airbus A-330-200 airliners. They will all be freighters. Presently, Avianca has 7 passenger Airbus A-330-200s.

Lufthansa ordered 2 Airbus A-380s, 4 Airbus A-320-s, and 1 Airbus A-330-300 as well as 5 Embraer E-195 regional jets.

American Airlines is close to bankruptcy. They will survive, though. A merger with some other airline is not out of the question - like U S Airways. American Airlines is decreasing its fourth quarter capacity by 3%. 200 pilots retired from American Airlines in August and September – 8 times the normal average.

Airbus has sold 1179 airliners this year up to October 1. Boeing has sold 426 airliners. So far this vear. Airbus has delivered 374 airliners, and Boeing has delivered 349.

Boeing projects a need over the next 20 years for 7,530 airliners for North America. Value would be about \$760 Billion. Most of the airliners would be single-aisle.

Airbus is considering boosting t he production rate of the Airbus A-320 to 50 per month to keep up with demands.

Qantas and Airbus announced a contract for 110 Airbus A-320s. This is the largest aircraft order in Australian history.

Airbus says that there have been over 7,900 orders for the Airbus A-320 series, with 4,790 delivered as of October 1.

American Airlines will retire 11 Boeing 757s in 2012. Also they will cut capacity by another 3% next Spring.

Ank Air, the airline of Nigeria, ordered 2 Boeing 747-800s valued at \$635 million.

Airbus delivered to China Southern Airlines, its first Airbus A-380 super jumbo jet. This is the first A-380 to be operated by the Chinese.

Airbus announced that they have sold a VIP A-380 jumbo to Saudi prince Al-Waleed bin Talal. It will be a "Flying Palace". After driving his Rolls Royce to the plane, he will have his Rolls parked in the onboard garage (Lower rear baggage area) The belly in the forward part of the plane is the relaxation area. including a Turkish bath lined with marble. Up stairs is a boardroom for business meeting with ultra hi tech equipment. The main "cabin" has five suites which form the owner's private quarters including king-sized beds. top-of-the-line entertainment systems, and a prayer room including computergenerated prayer rugs which always face towards Mecca. Also there is a baby grand piano and seating for ten. There are 20 "sleepers" - the equivalent of First Class seats for guests. There is also a movie theatre with plush leather seats the color of sand dunes. and a gvm with nautilus equipment including running machines. A large silk bed designed to resemble a Bedouin tent that will be the centerpiece of the plane's interior. Cost of the airplane is \$320 million, plus the interior will cost about \$176 million, plus \$60 million for goldleaf paint. You could say that this is "Lawrence of Arabia meets Star Wars"
