
If coming from the western Twin Cities going east on 494:

- Turn right (south) onto Henry Ave. and go approximately .2

miles toward the Fleming Field airport terminal building. If coming from east Twin Cities on

westbound 494:

- Exit at the 7th and 5th Avenue exit (Exit No.65)
- Turn left (South) on 7th Ave and go approximately .6 miles to a 4-way Stop sign. This is South Street W. To your left front there will be a small strip mall; to your right there will be an Amoco station.
- Turn left (East) at the 4-way Stop onto
- South Street W and go approximately .4 miles. Along the way you will encounter two more Stop signs—the third Stop sign (Henry Avenue) will be a "T" intersection. At the "T" intersection on your left will be homes and on your right softball fields.

This aircraft, "Greased Lightening", set a speed record from Tokyo to London on Oct 16, 1963, 8028 miles with an average speed of 938 mph, taking 8 hrs 35 min and 20.4 seconds. A second speed record from Tokyo to Anchorage of 3 hrs 9 min and 41.8 seconds averaging 1098 mph. The pod underneath carried nuclear bomb and extra fuel tanks.

Azul, the third largest airline in Brazil, ordered 6 Airbus A-330s and 5 Airbus A-350s for deliveries beginning in 2017. These aircraft will be utilized for routes into the US.

Shandong Airlines has ordered 50 Boeing 737-800s through the Chinese Communist Government. Value of the deal is \$4.6 Billion.

Aeroflot, the Russian airline, now has 100 airbus A-320s in their fleet. Boeing delivered the 75th Boeing 747 to Lufthansa in May. Lufthansa has one more on order. Lufthansa received their first 747 in 1970 - 44 years ago!!

Pan American is back!!A holding company purchased the rights to the name and logo of old Pan Am.They are leasing Boeing 737-800s.

Delta Airlines will begin service to Zurich, Switzerland and Rome, Italy year round beginning on June 16.

Odyssey Airlines is a new airline just getting organized now. It will be for business travelers. They are leasing 10 Bombardier C series airliners that have the range to fly London to New York. It holds 40 passengers.

Emirates Airlines and Etihad Airlines are launching a new service. It is Premium Class. There are actual bedrooms in the first class section of various airliners. It contains bedroom doors, a double bed, flat screen TV, and a bathroom. They are in a "luxury race" with Qatar Airlines, the only 5 star airline in the world. They are planning an upgrade from this Premium

Class. It is called Residence Service. This has more floor space than Premium Class. It includes a double bed, bathroom, lounge area, and a butler - not a Flight Attendant. This will be available only on the Airbus A-380. Fare from London to Abu Dhabi is \$20,000 one way. A private jet would cost close to \$100,000.

Qatar Airlines launched on May 15, a new business class service to London using Airbus A-319s. Instead of having 100 seats, it holds 40.

Ryan Air, the largest low cost carrier in Europe, will expand with flights to the US by 2019. They are based in Ireland. (Shades of Freddie Laker).

China Southern Airlines, Asia's largest airline by passengers carried, ordered, via the Chinese Communist Government, 80 more airbus A-320s for \$2.3 Billion. China Southern also ordered 70 Airbus A-320s in March. They will be built at the Airbus factory in China.

NORTHWEST AIRLINES FREIGHTERS

After the 2008 merger between Delta Airlines and Northwest Airlines, Delta, as the surviving airline, decided to retire all of the Boeing 747-200s in the Northwest fleet, including the freighters. NWA had 12 freighters with swing-up noses.

The last freighter flight was on December 19, 2009 as the 747 freighter touched down at Chicago from Osaka, Japan with a full load of 75 tons of freight. It was Boeing 747-251F, N632NW. The data on some of the NWA freighters are as follows:

Most were stored at Marana Air Park in Arizona. The above 8 freighters retired in December of 2009. Another 4 had already been retired by Delta, shortly after the merger, In August of 2010, Delta sold all twelve freighters to Kalitta Air of Ypsilanti, Michigan.

Flew from bases in Pakistan and UK until May 1960 when Francis Gary Powers was shot down by a Russian SAM. Initially aircraft pictured was a U-2A but converted to a "C" in 1968. Delivered to museum in 1982. U-2's are still being used for ISR missions around the globe.

Known as the "Magnesium Monster" by its pilots, it was the largest production aircraft ever built. These aircraft never dropped a bomb in a wartime situation. With the B-47 and B-52 on the -line these aircraft were withdrawn from service in 1959. If you want to see one of these aircraft fly, watch the movie "Strategic Air Command" starring James Stewart.
