Directions to the Club Meeting Location

Where: South St. Paul Municipal Airport, a.k.a. Fleming Field, located on the southern extremity of South St. Paul, south of 1-494, west of Concord Street and East of Highway 52.

If coming from the western Twin Cities going east on 494:

- Exit at the 7th and 5th Avenue exit (Exit No.65)

If coming from east Twin Cities on westbound 494:

- Turn left (East) at the 4-way Stop onto
- South Street W and go approximately .4 miles. Along the way you will encounter two more Stop signs—the third Stop sign (Henry Avenue) will be a "T" intersection. At the "T" intersection on your left will be homes and on your right softball fields.

UPS will hire 1700 workers for their Utah distribution hub.

Boeing announced that their future 777-8 and 777-9 would have folding wingtips, reducing the wingspan from 235 feet to 212 feet.

Boeing is estimating that 246.1 million people will fly this summer. June 1 through August 31.

Southwest Airlines is considering f lights to Canada and Europe.

Boeing announced that they sold 16 BBJs in 2017. So far this year, Boeing has sold 4 more BBJs. All are the 737-800 model.

Singapore Airlines will begin the longest commercial flight in the world this October. It will be from Singapore to New York City. It is 8,277 nautical miles or about 10,000 miles.
