

Directions to the Club Meeting Location

Where: South St. Paul Municipal Airport, a.k.a. Fleming Field, located on the southern extremity of South St. Paul, south of 1-494, west of Concord Street and East of Highway 52.

If coming from the western Twin Cities going east on 494:

- Exit at the 7th and 5th Avenue exit (Exit No.65)
- Turn right (South) on 7th Ave and go approximately .6 miles to a 4-way Stop sign. This is South Street W. To your left there will be a McDonald's; to your right front there will be a Walgreen's.
- Turn left (East) at the 4-way Stop onto
- South Street W and go approximately .6 miles. Along the way you will encounter three more Stop signs—the third Stop sign (Henry Avenue) will be a "T" intersection. At the "T" intersection on your left will be homes and on your right softball fields.
- Turn right (south) onto Henry Ave. and go approximately .2

- miles toward the Fleming Field airport terminal building.

If coming from east Twin Cities on westbound 494:

- Exit at the 7th and 5th Avenue exit (Exit No.65)
- Turn left (South) on 7th Ave and go approximately .6 miles to a 4-way Stop sign. This is South Street W. To your left front there will be a small strip mall; to your right there will be an Amoco station.
- Turn left (East) at the 4-way Stop onto
- South Street W and go approximately .4 miles. Along the way you will encounter two more Stop signs—the third Stop sign (Henry Avenue) will be a "T" intersection. At the "T" intersection on your left will be homes and on your right softball fields.
- Turn right (south) onto Henry Ave. and go approximately .2 miles toward the Fleming Field airport terminal building

The terminal is on the right with parking available.

In addition, I got in touch with the Troy, Wisconsin facility that did the work to make it into a two-place Mustang, and they sent me cockpit shots of the red leatherette interior they added per Mr. McCann's request. I started in the cockpit, removing the radio gear and using a spare Mustang seat I had. Half round plastic strips represented the pleating on the seat and on the sidewalls. It was just one of those things where an idea worked and the whole cockpit came out just fine. The rest of the build proceeded as normal and a coat of Testors enamel black adorned the airframe. Greg's decals did the rest. I staggered the inner gear doors to represent their un-even bleed down after the engine is shut down and I also dropped the flaps. Although kind of a major build, you can see the end result and when I come to a meeting(!) I'll bring it along. Greg's decals for CF-FUZ are also available in 1/48th scale, should anyone want to build that model in that scale. Good modeling to youse guys, and I hope to see you soon.</p>

So, here's an interesting fact. At one time, the Twin Cities and the surrounding metro area had 37 hobby shops, now we have just a handful.

My goodness, how times have changed....

Names such as **Medical Center Cycle, Jolly's, Rings Hobby Shop, University Hobbies, Gagers,** and **Woodcraft Hobby** were legendary and certainly bring back fond memories for all of us who have been a part of the modeling community for all these years. But the most celebrated hobby shop of all in the Twin Cities was undoubtedly, **Custom Model Hobby**, which was located on the corner of 44th Street and Minnehaha Avenue in South Minneapolis. ***It was simply plastic modeling heaven!!***

Known by such nicknames as "**Custom**" or merely, "**the Shop**," it began its legacy at the original site on 35th Street and Cedar Avenue in the middle '70s, then finally moving to its final location on 44th Street and Minnehaha Ave.

Economic challenges and a changing hobby market led the owners Ray and Mae Schroeder to close **Custom Model Hobby** in the summer of 1982. On August 22, 1982 at 7:00pm the key was turned on the locks of the front door and the "**the Shop**" was gone forever. *Can you believe that was 37 years ago?*

The building saw many changes over the next three decades. It first became **Custom Crafts**; an expansion of Mae Schroeder's other business interest. Over the years it housed many businesses from a photography studio to a real estate office. Presently it is the site of **Parkway Pizza**, a local neighborhood award winning pizza restaurant. The actual area of the building that housed **Custom Model Hobby** is now a portion of their dining area!!

I thought it would be fun to take a trip down memory lane and celebrate the memories we shared and the friendships that began at **Custom Model Hobby** all those years ago.

Therefore, arrangements have been made for a **Custom Model Hobby Reunion Galato** to be held on Friday, November 22, 2019 at 6:00pm at **Parkway Pizza**, located at 4359 Minnehaha Avenue, Minneapolis, Minnesota 55406. The restaurant owners have agreed to turn their dining room, the site of the old **Custom Model Hobby**, into our own private dining area exclusively for this event!!
