

US Navy NE-1 by Frank Cuden

Years ago, I bought a 1/48th scale "Piper's" Propagteam decal sheet and I recently got around to building the 1/48th scale Hobby Craft kit that has languished in my cabinet of un-built future projects. One of the choices on the decal sheet was for a Navy-designated NE-1 that was attached to the 32nd LTA (Lighter Than Air) Squadron. The squadron had patrol blimps and

was based at Moffet Field.

I added a lot to the cockpit and I sanded the top and bottom wings to attain the stretched fabric look. I also had to make new cooling shrouds for the top of the exposed cylinders. The prop was painted light tan and I streaked the "wood grain", using Testors enamel Wood. I added fine wire for the exposed aileron cables on the top and bottom of the wings along with the bracing wires between the horizontal and vertical tail.

The fuselage halves were molded in clear plastic so I went through a lot of Tamiya Masking Tape as I first masked the inside of the side windows so I could spray Floquil Engine Black in the cockpit. The Navy painted the interiors of those Cubs black. Later on in the build. I had to mask the outsides of the windows when the blue and gray the were sprayed on model. Model Master Light Gull Gray and Intermediate Blue were (Continued on page 4)

I will be thinking of you all on November 12th while I'm in "Blighty" and will raise a pint to TCAH!! Cheers lads!!


Treasurer's Report by Dennis Strand

Directions to the Club Meeting Location

Where: South St. Paul Municipal Airport, a.k.a. Fleming Field, located on the southern extremity of South St. Paul, south of 1-494, west of Concord Street and East of Highway 52.

If coming from the western Twin Cities going east on 494:

- Exit at the 7th and 5th Avenue exit (Exit No.65)
- Turn right (South) on 7th Ave and go approximately .6 miles to a 4-way Stop sign. This is South Street W. To your left there will be a McDonald's; to your right front there will be a Walgreen's.
- Turn left (East) at the 4-way Stop onto
- South Street W and go approximately .6 miles. Along the way you will encounter three more Stop signs—the third Stop sign (Henry Avenue) will be a "T" intersection. At the "T" intersection on your left will be homes and on your right softball fields.
- Turn right (south) onto Henry Ave. and go approximately .2
