Directions to the Club Meeting Location

Where: South St. Paul Municipal Airport, a.k.a. Fleming Field, located on the southern extremity of South St. Paul, south of 1-494, west of Concord Street and East of Highway 52.

If coming from the western Twin Cities going east on 494:

- Exit at the 7th and 5th Avenue exit (Exit No.65)
- Turn right (South) on 7th Ave and go approximately .6 miles to a 4-way Stop sign. This is South Street W. To your left there will be a McDonald's; to your right front there will be a Walgreen's.
- Turn left (East) at the 4-way Stop onto
- South Street W and go approximately .6 miles. Along the way you will encounter three more Stop signs—the third Stop sign (Henry Avenue) will be a "T" intersection. At the "T" intersection on your left will be homes and on your right softball fields.
- Turn right (south) onto Henry Ave. and go approximately .2

 miles toward the Fleming Field airport terminal building.

If coming from east Twin Cities on westbound 494:

- Exit at the 7th and 5th Avenue exit (Exit No.65)
- Turn left (South) on 7th Ave and go approximately .6 miles to a 4-way Stop sign. This is South Street W. To your left front there will be a small strip mall; to your right there will be an Amoco station.
- Turn left (East) at the 4-way Stop onto
- South Street W and go approximately .4 miles. Along the way you will encounter two more Stop signs—the third Stop sign (Henry Avenue) will be a "T" intersection. At the "T" intersection on your left will be homes and on your right softball fields.
- Turn right (south) onto Henry Ave. and go approximately .2 miles toward the Fleming Field airport terminal building

The terminal is on the right with parking available.





Meeting Minutes

The November meeting of the Twin City Aero Historians was called to order at 1:00 PM. An inquiry was made for any quests or new members that were present. We were in luck and welcomed Kevin Waba, Jeremy Fox and Thomas L Crayne as new members. Kevin has a huge collection of unbuilt kits and is currently working on 1/144 scale aircraft models. Welcome aboard gentlemen! Also, Jay Budge brought a guest who also graced us with a very informative talk about his military experiences. His name was David May and he was a U.S. Marine Captain and CO of an Amtrac unit in Viet Nam Circa. 1965. He spoke of several of his encounters with the enemy which included a time when his unit was pinned down in a rice paddy. Fortunately an A-6 Intruder came diving out of the clouds and fired a string of rockets along the tree line. Captain May said, "After that, there was no more shooting from the tree line." There is no doubt that the Intruder attack saved many American lives.

When Old Business was brought up we were reminded of the passing of Mike Sibley. He was a long time member and was a previous president of TCAH. Those present honored him with a moment of silence. On another somber note, a flower arrangement was sent by the Twin City Aero Historians to the Memorial Service for our member Dave DeBace, who died shortly after our most recent Nordic Con.

An update on the club displays in the Commemorative Air Force hangar was then addressed. The "Hookem' Cow" Liberator was a B-24H which served in England during WWII. It was named bythe pilot and crew chief, who were both from South St. Paul. The name was derived from an organization founded in 1916 that promoted the city's stockyard and meat packing industry. The CAF asked if TCAH could make a model of it and we accommodated. Erik Zabel built a great 1/72 scale rendition and it was adorned with an accurate set of decals produced by Don Stauffer. Although, it was previously displayed before for a brief period of time, it has now been placed in a new and improved display to include placards and photos in addition to the model. Erik and Don are given credit on a small placard and their membership to the Twin City Aero Historians is noted.

The theme of our large display case has been changed from U.S. Naval Aviation of the Second World War to a multinational display of WWII warplanes. There are 17 1/48 scale models representing 14 different countries. Many subjects from single engine fighters to 4 engine bombers are present. There were several positive comments while we were setting up, so take a look if you get a chance.

Honoring U.S. Naval Aviation training that occurred in the Twin City area.

3.) A TB-25K radar training aircraft that illustrates how "Miss Mitchell", the CAF's 1/1 scale B-25,

appeared in 1958.

A reminder was given about the "White Elephant" event that is scheduled for the December meeting. This is when people bring a decent unbuilt model that has been gift wrapped. The participants place them all together on a table then draw numbers. Each person goes up in turn and selects a "Christmas present".
