

Directions to the Club Meeting Location

Where: South St. Paul Municipal Airport, a.k.a. Fleming Field, located on the southern extremity of South St. Paul, south of 1-494, west of Concord Street and East of Highway 52.

If coming from the western Twin Cities going east on 494:

- Exit at the 7th and 5th Avenue exit (Exit No.65)
- Turn right (South) on 7th Ave and go approximately .6 miles to a 4-way Stop sign. This is South Street W. To your left there will be a McDonald's; to your right front there will be a Walgreen's.
- Turn left (East) at the 4-way Stop onto
- South Street W and go approximately .6 miles. Along the way you will encounter three more Stop signs—the third Stop sign (Henry Avenue) will be a "T" intersection. At the "T" intersection on your left will be homes and on your right softball fields.
- Turn right (south) onto Henry Ave. and go approximately .2

- miles toward the Fleming Field airport terminal building.
- If coming from east Twin Cities on westbound 494:**

- Exit at the 7th and 5th Avenue exit (Exit No.65)
- Turn left (South) on 7th Ave and go approximately .6 miles to a 4-way Stop sign. This is South Street W. To your left front there will be a small strip mall; to your right there will be an Amoco station.
- Turn left (East) at the 4-way Stop onto
- South Street W and go approximately .4 miles. Along the way you will encounter two more Stop signs—the third Stop sign (Henry Avenue) will be a "T" intersection. At the "T" intersection on your left will be homes and on your right softball fields.
- Turn right (south) onto Henry Ave. and go approximately .2 miles toward the Fleming Field airport terminal building

The terminal is on the right with parking available.

still exists those being Philippine Mars and Hawaii Mars.

The "Marshal Mars" ended its life on April 5 1950 after suffering engine fire landing on the water, burned and exploded sinking in the process, off of Ke 'ehl Lagoon in Honolulu.

The posted photos are of the "Marshall Mars" at Pearl getting an engine serviced as my brother Phil Fries stated as it had returned after leaving earlier and reported it had lost an engine over Diamond Head. Phil had taken these photos when based at Pearl in 1946.

Note: The boat had no landing gear it begs to wonder what was used to get her on the tarmac for repair.



Martin JRM Mars by Jeff Fries

The JRM1 was a development flying boat series for the U. S. Navy by the Glenn L. Martin Company.

Wingspan 200ft Length 117ft
Engines 4 R-3350 Cyclones giving 2000 hp .The aircraft's top speed of 243 mph ceiling at

19,700 ft and a range of 3700 miles.

The first one called Hawaii Mars had a V tail and during early tests suffered a fire and burned in the Cheesecake Bay area.

The remaining aircraft were named "Caroline Mars", "Hawaii II Mars", "Philippine

Mars", "Marianas Mars" and "Marshall Mars."

In 1959 four of these aircraft were sold to the British Columbia Forest Companies and were converted with water tanks to serve as "Water Bombers" to fight forest fires. They also displayed new paint schemes of white and red. Today only two
